

BEWL WATER FISHING REPORT

September 2025

Water level: 51.8%

We're pleased to report that 6,000 fish have now safely arrived at Bewl Water, marking a strong start to our autumn stocking programme. Fishing has shown slight improvement despite recent weather challenges. Water levels are continuing to drop rapidly — around 56mm per day — which has begun to expose some muddy banks. Please take extra care when walking the margins, as access may be tricky in places.

Looking ahead, another 3,000 trout are scheduled to be stocked next week, bringing the total for September to 9,000. This forms part of our ongoing effort to enhance the fishery and support anglers through the cooler months.

We're already seeing results, with trout being reported and the most consistent catches coming from depths of around 10ft.

Hotspots to Try

Anglers have had success around:

- Hook House
- Chingley
- Wards Lane

These areas are especially productive in the early morning or late afternoon, when fish are most active.

The Bewl Daiwa Southeast Reservoir Championship – A Successful Event!

We recently hosted the second annual Bewl Daiwa Southeast Reservoir Championship, and it proved another fantastic event for our venue and all involved.

The practice day fished slightly better, with fewer anglers on the water and fish feeding more freely. However, the competition day still delivered some excellent weights and showcased the potential of the reservoir.

Top performances on the day:

In addition to the podium weights, several other anglers recorded bags over 20lb, once again proving Bewl Water's reputation as a top-class coarse fishing venue.
